

CAMPUS MONUMENT SIGNAGE GETS REVAMPED



The new monument signage around campus implements the new university lockup which combines the iconic Bull-U icon with the university wordmark.

As USF Tampa, St. Pete, and Sarasota-Manatee came together as One USF through the consolidation process, it became important to create a unifying image across the campuses. Unification of signage helps create a more pleasing and cohesive look for people coming onto campus.

The signage project took four weeks for planning and pricing and an additional four weeks for construction. In addition to the monument signs, the large USF logo on the north side of the Student Services (SVC) building was also updated. This location is significant as it is a very popular location for photos.

Chaddy Hanwisai, Campus Planning Project Manager, says the most challenging part of the project was scheduling sign removal, monument repair, and sign installation so no monuments were missing for long durations. The project came in on time and under budget even with the additional sign at SVC.
