



HONORS COLLEGE POWER UP

On the morning of July 14, the Maintenance and Utilities Services Department energized the new Judy Genshaft Honors College building's permanent power up to the USF main switchboard.

The OAS high-voltage electrician team is composed of Greg See, Robert Contorno, Lonnie Austin, and John Benedict. They are responsible for providing preventative and corrective maintenance on the high-voltage and 480-volt distribution systems for our power plants and Utilities infrastructure.

The process of powering the building involved months of planning and a couple of weeks of execution. Once the manholes were isolated and the building was de-energized, TECO Energy began the process that led to energizing the gear.

After the contractor completed their scope of work, the high-voltage electrician team conducted an inspection and started energizing feeders, verifying voltage and phasing, and finally testing the voltage on the secondary side of the transformer to ensure there was proper rotation for the equipment inside the building.

When it comes to safety measures, the high-voltage electricians use a personal protection gear called arc flash protection suit, or 'moon suit', which is designed to shield them from serious injuries that may be caused by common at-work hazards. For further protection, there is electrical protection for the hands, insulated sticks for different operations of switches and transformers, and a clearance range for unqualified individuals.

On August 10, the new Wellness Center was also energized, following a similar process.
