#### Freshmen (First Time in College/FTIC)

- USF enrolled 3,868 FTIC students (Tampa campus: 3,515, St. Petersburg campus: 353)

- 52% graduated within the top 20% of their high school class
- 92% Florida resident freshmen are Bright Futures scholarship recipients
- 31% minorities
- 3,661 Florida freshmen come from 445 high schools in 50 counties

#### DID YOU KNOW?

- USF is one of only three Florida public universities classified by the Carnegie Foundation in the top tier of research universities, and one of 39 four-year U.S. public colleges and universities (the only one in Florida) classified as "Community Engaged."
- USF is the ninth largest public university in the nation.
- USF placed #14 among the nation's top 20 "up and coming universities" in the 2009 U.S. News & World Report college rankings.
- USF President Judy Genshaft signed the historic American College & University Presidents Climate Commitment, solidifying USF's dedication to fighting global warming.
- USF's Pediatric Epidemiology Center has received \$300 million in National Institutes of Health funding to direct global efforts in juvenile diabetes research.
- USF is one of the top 50 U.S. medical schools receiving funding from the National Institutes of Health.
- USF ranks first in Florida and fifth nationally for Alternative Spring Break participation.
- The Bulls football team rose as high as #2 in the AP national rankings in 2007 and began 2008 ranked #19 nationally by AP and #21 by the Coaches' Poll.
- USF has 212,000 alumni representing all 50 states and 124 nations.
- USF is the first university in Florida and the first major public research university in the Southeast to establish a Confucius Institute.
- Part of the Florida Energy Systems Consortium, USF's Clean Energy Research Center is a leader in photovoltaic technologies and solar thermal technologies.
- The Tampa campus is in a construction boom with more than \$300 million recently completed or planned projects.
- USF's new Marshall Student Center is a 233,000 square-foot center that includes a 1,100-seat ballroom, 700-seat theater, meeting rooms and spacious eating areas.


