The USF Board of Trustees is responsible for cost-effective policy decisions appropriate to the system mission and the implementation and maintenance of high-quality education programs within the laws and rules of the state. Campus Boards for USF St. Petersburg and USF Sarasota-Manatee are appointed by the USF Board of Trustees. The USF Board of Trustees was created in 2001. by the Florida legislature.

The 13 trustees include distinguished figures in accounting, banking, business, education, law, technology, philanthropy and public policy leadership. - The University of South Florida System is home to a student body of 50,577 students representing over 145 different countries.
- USF Tampa ranks #1 in student success and is the nation's top performer in "overall student success" among 1,100 public research and doctoral universities according to the 2016 Eduventures Student Success ratings.

- USF Tampa's Fall 2017 freshman academic profile posts an average SAT score of 1280 and a high school GPA of 4.12, which exceeds the Florida Board of Governors Preeminence benchmarks.

- USF Tampa was named one of the Top 100 Best Values in Public Colleges (#66 in-state, #27 out-of-state) by Kiplinger's Personal Finance for 2017.
- USF Tampa graduate level programs continue to be ranked among the best according to the 2018 U.S. News and World Report Graduate School Rankings. The University of South Florida is classified by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching in the Doctoral Universities: Highest Research Activity category, a distinction attained by only 2.5 percent of all universities. Designated as Florida's first Emerging Preeminent University by the Florida Board of Governors, USF comprises the main campus in Tampa, USF Health, and the College of Marine Science and is the doctoral granting, research-intensive member of the USF System.
