

According to the U.S. Department of State, the University of South Florida is a **TOP PRODUCER** nationally for the number of Fulbright scholars for the 2021-2022 period.

The ranking, first published by <u>The Chronicle of Higher Education</u>, shows no other Florida university produced more Fulbright scholars than USF. This is the eighth consecutive year that USF ranks among the top university sponsors of Faculty Fulbright Awards nationally.

Seven USF faculty members earned the highly competitive award and represent a wide range of disciplines, including biomedical engineering, education, business, philosophy and psychology.
