There are **12** partnership agreements between USF and **12** Institutions in India. These include:

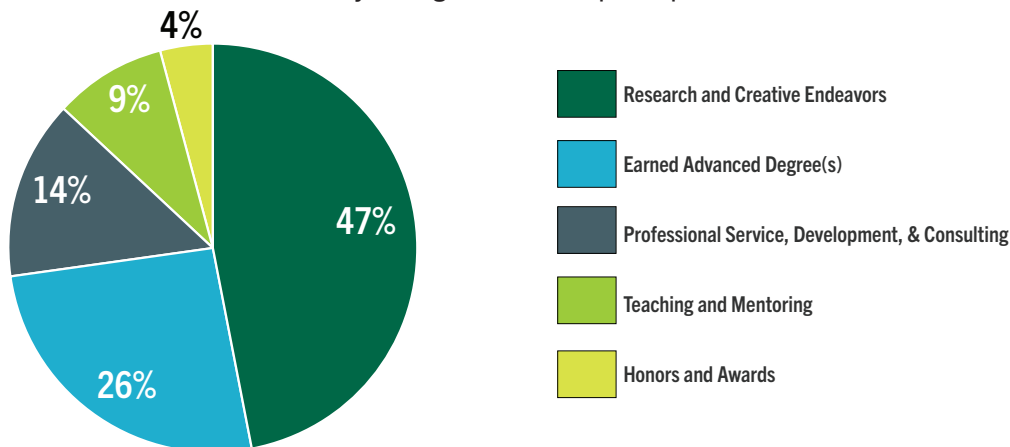

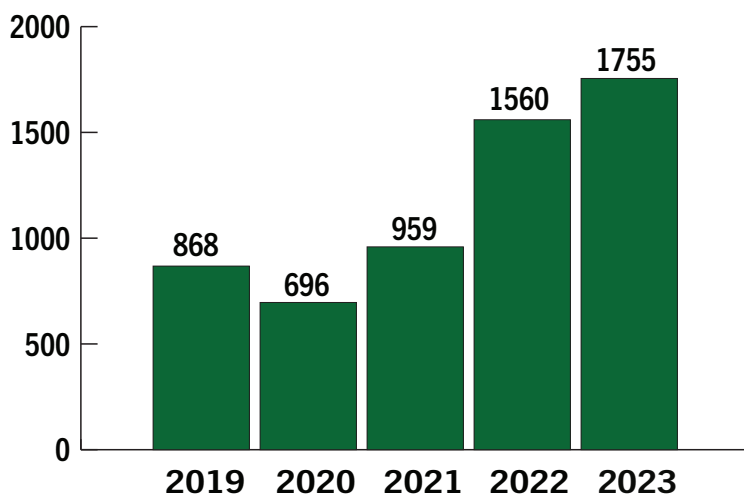

USF RESEARCH PUBLICATIONS WITH COLLEAGUES FROM INDIA

From 2018-2022, USF researchers had **426** publications with collaborators in India. Top institutional collaborators included the Indian Institute of Technology System, Indian Council of Scientific and Industrial Research, Indian Institute of Science, National Institute of Sciences, and Aligarh Muslim University. Top research areas included biochemistry and molecular biology, materials science, chemistry, cell biology, and environmental sciences.
