INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY GRAND OPENING

Only 15 months after the building's groundbreaking, the Porter Family Indoor Practice Facility has officially opened. University leadership, alumni, trustees, staff, coaches, and athletes gathered on January 10 to celebrate this transformational step in USF's future.

The 88,000 square-foot facility features a 100-yard turf field, observation deck, reception lobby, outdoor plaza, scoreboard, and a video production area. The facility will be open to all student-athletes and provides them a space to practice under cover, an enormous benefit in Florida's climate. The facility not only serves as a practice space, but also as a recruiting tool.

"When we link up arms, there's truly nothing we can't do" said USF president Rhea Law. "But in the end, it's truly all about what's best for our students."
