- Responsibilities:** Conduct research, seek external funding, publish in areas of interest, develop and teach graduate and undergraduate courses in areas of specialty, advise Master's and Doctoral students and provide service to the department, college, university, community and profession. Summer teaching is possible.

The University of South Florida is one of the nation's top 73 public research universities and one of only 41 public research universities nationwide with very high research activity that is designated as community engaged by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching. According to the National Science Foundation, USF ranks 50th in the nation for federal expenditures in research and total expenditures in research among all U.S. universities, public or private, and is ranked 44th in total research expenditures and 34th in federal research expenditures for public universities. In FY2011, USF generated over \$391.8 million in sponsored research. According to the Chronicle of Higher Education, the 213% increase in federal funds for academic research and development achieved by USF researchers from 2002-2007 was unmatched, and represented by far the highest percentage increase in the country.

USF is a comprehensive multi-campus research university serving more than 47,000 students with fiscally autonomous, yet complementary, campuses in Tampa (including USF Health), St. Petersburg, Sarasota-Manatee, and Lakeland. USF has numerous research and health care partnerships through affiliation agreements with the H. Lee Moffitt Cancer Center and Research Institute, James A. Haley Veterans Hospital, Bay Pines Veterans Hospital, Tampa General Hospital, All Children's Hospital and Bayfront Medical Center, Shriner's Children's Hospital, Florida Hospital, the Johnnie B. Byrd, Sr. Alzheimer's Center and Research Institute, and the US Geological Survey. Throughout the university's development, the faculty at USF have identified and satisfied needs on a local, national and global scale. A variety of activities in such areas as health care, neuroscience, transportation, biodefense, education and engineering are conducted by specialized research and development centers and institutes. The university currently has over 100 such centers and institutes – many of which function in an interdisciplinary fashion, enabling coordination of projects across colleges.

The Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders at the University of South Florida is the one of the largest in the State of Florida. It offers a variety of fully accredited programs for baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral degrees. The undergraduate student may major in Communication Sciences and Disorders, American Sign Language, Deaf Education, or Educational Interpreting. On the graduate level, students may elect to pursue a master's degree (M.S.) in Speech-Language Pathology, a clinical doctorate (Au.D.) in Audiology, or a research doctorate (Ph.D.) in Speech, Language, Hearing, or Neurocommunicative Sciences. In addition, graduate students with a research interest may pursue collaborative doctoral studies with Psychology, Education, or Aging Studies.
