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The project design is modeled after the evidenced based approach, **APIC (assess, plan, identify and coordinate)** that provides validated screening, assessment, and community re-entry from jails for individuals with severe mental illness. The clinical criteria for admission into the project are individuals with a primary axis I diagnosis of bipolar and/or related disorders, schizophrenia spectrum and other psychotic and depressive disorders. Those individuals that meet clinical criteria also must meet criteria as a high utilizer. The high utilizer criteria are as follows:

1. Individuals with a minimum of one (1) arrest or violation of probation and two (2) Involuntary examinations/baker act/crisis stabilization admissions within a 12-month period; or
2. Discharged or awaiting placement at a State Mental Health Treatment Facility (STMHTF).

Upon entry into the jail, individuals will continue to be processed by the Jail Healthcare Provider who gathers initial identification information for all reported and observed medical, mental health, and substance use disorders. For this project, when an individual is identified with a mental health issue by the Healthcare Provider, an immediate referral is made to the project along with a copy of relevant collateral information. STMHTF individuals meeting criteria will be direct referrals to the outpatient component of the project. The project Clinician then conducts their initial screening/interview utilizing the screening tools outlined below. Screening tools and collateral documents include:

- Brief Jail Mental Health Screen (BJMHS)
- Adverse Childhood Experience Questionnaire (ACE)
- Patient Health Questionnaire (PHQ-9)
- Mood Disorder Questionnaire (MDQ)
- General Anxiety Disorder (GAD-7)
- Alcohol Use Disorder Identification Test Consumption (AUDIT-C)
- Drug Abuse Screening Test (DAST)
- Pasco Sheriff Office "High Utilizer" Report
- Collateral Clinical Documents
- GAINS Re-Entry Checklist and Transition Plan

Following the initial screening/interview the Licensed Clinician will then meet either virtually or face to face with the individual to complete the Comprehensive Assessment battery consisting of the following tools:

- In-Depth Bio-Psychosocial Assessment
- Multidimensional Quality of Life Questionnaire (MQOL)

BayCare Behavioral Health submitted the 2017 Sequential Intercept Mapping (SIM) to use as a catalyst for this CJMHSA application. We have been in communication with Abigail Shockley, Director of Criminal Justice, Mental Health, and Substance Abuse Technical Assistance Center (TAC), and intend to coordinate and develop an updated SIM with the most current re-entry goals and intercepts. During the planning process, BayCare will work with TAC to refine the ATIP-JR strategic plan and address mental health, substance use, and co-occurring needs in Pasco County, analyzing and addressing outcomes evaluation, and long-term project sustainability.

Upon award, BayCare Behavioral Health in conjunction with TAC will conduct a SIM workshop and corresponding SIM report during program year one for BayCare Behavioral Health and Pasco County. The SIM will build consensus, establish program priorities, identify evidenced-based treatment models, and establish a concrete action plan for persons with mental health, substance use and/or co-occurring disorders involved in the criminal justice system in Pasco County.
