The Golden Bull Award is one of USF's highest honors given annually (in the spring semester) to up to 20 deserving undergraduate and graduate students who encompass the spirit of USF and have demonstrated its values. Recipients must exemplify exceptional leadership and service to the University and the community and meet the following criteria to apply for the award: Must have completed a minimum of 60 semester hours for undergraduate or 12 hours for graduate by the Fall semester of the year that you apply. All authorized credits toward degrees count in this tabulation, including dual enrollment and transfer credits.

- Must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0.
- Must be in good standing with the university.
- Must have demonstrated a commitment to the values of USF and leadership on campus.
