Meet the President-Elect



Dr. Steve Currall, USF's President-Elect, will be the university's 7th president.

The University of South Florida's Board of Trustees has named Dr. Steve Currall the 7th President of the USF System. Dr. Currall will succeed Dr. Judy Genshaft on July 1st, 2019 after her 19 years leading USF to Preeminence.

"I am thrilled to be selected to lead the University of South Florida at such a pivotal time in its history," Currall said. "USF's trajectory is unlike any other public university in the country, and there is so much promise. I'm deeply grateful to the Board of Trustees and the USF community for the opportunity to build on the momentum created during

President Genshaft's transformational tenure."

Dr. Currall currently is the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at Southern Methodist University and brings with him extensive experience in academic excellence and leadership. Currall holds a Ph.D. in Organizational Behavior from Cornell University and has taught in his field for nearly 30 years. This experience will be essential in navigating the upcoming USF consolidation which will be a prime focus during his first few years leading USF. Downtown MCOM Building Update

The Morsani College of Medicine + Heart Institute is expected to open by the end of 2019 in downtown Tampa. Considered the anchor for the rest of the Water Street Tampa project (revitalization of the Channelside District), this building has become a new landmark for USF. Throughout the construction of the building we have provided continuous updates to show you the tremendous progress being made.

Since the last update at the 4th Quarter Townhall in January, signage has begun to go up on each side of the building and the curtain walls (glass windows lining the length of the building) have been fully installed. The large portion of the work remaining is on the inside of the building.



Volunteer Registration Now Open for the 2019 Warrior Games

U.S. Special Operations Command is hosting the 2019 Department of Defense Warrior Games which are coming to Tampa June 21-30. Volunteers are a crucial part of making Warrior Games successful. They

welcome all those within the USSOCOM enterprise who are eligible to volunteer and want to contribute their time to an event that supports and encourages wounded warriors to compete amongst other athletes in adaptive sports. The Games will be held throughout the Tampa Bay area to include: Tampa Convention Center, University of South Florida, Long Aquatic Center (Clearwater), Eagles Golf Course (Odessa), Bayshore Boulevard, and MacDill Air Force Base.

Approximately 300 wounded, ill and injured service members and veterans will participate in the competition. The athletes will represent the United States Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, and Special Operations Command. Athletes from various international armed forces will also compete. Teams include active, reserve component and veterans that will go head-to-head in 14 sports, including archery, swimming, wheelchair basketball and indoor rowing. For the first time in Warrior Games history golf, wheelchair tennis and wheelchair rugby will be included

There are multiple days, times, shifts, and athletic events available based on your personal schedule. And remember, even if you can't commit to volunteer, your presence during the athletic competition is always welcome.
