The university broke ground on the new home of the Judy Genshaft Honors College, a five-story, 85,000-square-foot facility that will strengthen USF's position to attract the best students.

The honors college aligns with USF's goals in student success and supports the university's long-term aspirations. The college consists of more than 2,400 high-achieving, cross-disciplinary scholars.

The new facility will feature interwoven spaces for classrooms, study areas, faculty and advisor offices, event areas, a computer lab, performance and create spaces and numerous collaborative spaces – expanding the range of academic opportunities for students and giving them a true “home” on campus. Construction is expected to be completed in late Fall of 2022.

ALL ABOUT THE KEY SHOP

Located to the right of the USF Post Office, the USF Key Shop issues keys, re-keys and/ or changes locks for all of the E&G buildings on-campus.

It's important that they have a well-functioning team as the Key Shop typically has a large workload. They cut approximately 5,000 keys each year, help unlock doors when individuals get locked out, supply master keys when needed, and perform maintenance on locks.

The key shop team is made up of three employees: David Whetsell, David Tong, and Eric Berrios. Each team member has their own special knowledge and talents, and they fit like a puzzle when they work together.

Whetsell, with over 30 years of experience at USF, brings a large amount of institutional knowledge and a strong work ethic.
