USF DEBUTS FIRST ELECTRIC BUS

USF celebrated Earth Day with the debuting of the first zero-emission electric bus in the Bull Runner fleet. The new bus was jointly funded by the University's Student Green Energy Fund and USF Parking and Transportation Services. The bus marks an important step in USF's commitment to sustainability in all of its operations. The new zero emission electric bus joined the Bull Runner fleet on April 22 and is believed to be the first electric bus owned and operated by a public university in the State of Florida.

By replacing a diesel bus with an electric bus, approximately 230,000 pounds of carbon dioxide are avoided each year. Electric buses also produce less noise pollution in the community and have a smoother rider experience. "The University of South Florida is excited for the continued partnership between Parking and Transportation Services and the Student Green Energy Fund that has made this project possible," said Raymond Mensah, director of USF Parking and Transportation Services and a member of the Student Green Energy Fund Council. "By launching a zero-emission electric bus, we are making a large stride in reaching our sustainability goals and reducing our carbon footprint."

USF CELEBRATES ARBOR DAY

USF celebrated Arbor Day 2021 by planting new trees around Castor Beach on the Tampa campus. This included a magnolia, five live oaks, three crape myrtles, and four palm trees. The celebration was made possible by a partnership with TECO, who worked with a local nursey to provide the trees.

USF's tree planting effort on the Tampa campus started in 2016 with a grant from the Student Green Energy Fund. Now on its third phase, over 1,000 trees have been planted across the Tampa campus, ranging from shade trees to ornamental flowering trees. The tree planting project is one reason USF continues to be recognized as a Tree Campus by the Arbor Day Foundation's Tree Campus Higher Education program.

USF has held this recognition since 2011 and is one of only a handful of schools in Florida to be recognized. The program recognizes colleges and universities that meet standards that promote healthy trees and student involvement. Currently, the USF Tampa campus has over 19,000 trees, which provides an estimated annual benefit of 1.8 million dollars, including energy conserved, storm water filtered, and carbon dioxide removed.
