

Grandparent Florida Residency Declaration for Grandparent Waiver



The state university Grandparent Waiver was created by the Florida Legislature to allow an out-of-state student with a grandparent who is a legal Florida resident to attend a state university and have out-of-state fees waived beginning in the fall of 2022. It is the student's responsibility to apply for this waiver and submit all necessary documentation in accordance with university deadlines. Waivers are limited in number by law and will be prioritized first-come, first-serve based on deposit date.

Provision of Documents to Support Claim of Florida Residency

Students must meet the following requirements to be eligible to receive the Grandparent Waiver. Have a grandparent who is a legal resident as defined in s. 1009.21(2)a., Florida Statutes.

1. The term "grandparent" means a person who has a legal relationship to a student's parent as the natural or adopted parent or legal guardian of the student's parent.
2. The same residency documentation that students provide to demonstrate Florida residency will be required for the grandparent.

The documents a grandparent must provide under Florida law to prove residency are detailed below. The documents must demonstrate that the grandparent has established legal residence in this state and must have maintained legal residence in this state for at least 12 consecutive months immediately prior to the grandchild's initial enrollment in an institution of higher education. Please note that you will need to submit at least two of these documents.

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A. Grandparent **must provide at least one** of the following of his/her personal documentation:

- Florida Voter's Registration Card

- Proof of permanent home in Florida occupied as primary residence for 12 consecutive months prior to the student's enrollment. (Required: document such as a deed or other evidence of title to property used as primary residence, a homeowner's policy, a title insurance policy, evidence of a property tax payment on the primary residence, or a lease of multiple years' duration)
- Proof of a homestead exemption in Florida. (Required: document from the county tax collector demonstrating the application of a homestead exemption to the claimant's primary residence.)
- Proof of permanent full-time employment in Florida for at least 30 hours per week for a 12 month period. (Required: pay stubs or W-2 form for past 12 consecutive months)

B. Grandparent **may provide one or more** documents from the following categories to demonstrate residency in Florida (to be used in conjunction with one document from above):

- Declaration of domicile in Florida.
- Florida professional or occupational license.
- Florida incorporation.
- Document evidencing family ties in Florida
- Proof of membership in a Florida-based charitable or professional organization.
- Any other documentation that supports your request for resident status, including, but not limited to, utility bills and proof of 12 consecutive months of payments; a lease agreement and proof of 12 consecutive months of payments; or an official state, federal, or court document evidencing legal ties to Florida.
