

USF is ranked #7 in America and #1 in Florida among all public universities for the most U.S. patents granted in 2018, according

to the Intellectual Property Owners Association.

Dr. Sanberg will lead the 6th Annual Florida Inventors Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony and Gala to be held on Friday September 20h at the Hilton Tampa Downtown.

Eight inventors will be recognized and inducted. They include:

Ms. **Hedy Lamarr** (1914-2000) "Hollywood icon and central Florida resident for her groundbreaking invention of the Secret Communication System, which led to technologies that support Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth, and cybersecurity.

National Medal of Science Laureate Dr. **Joanna S. Fowler** (B.A. '64), who is being honored for her transformative research in imaging technology that identifies and treats illnesses of the brain."
