Dr. Leahy announced that Dr. **Milton Johnston** would retire at the end of the Fall term.

Dr. Johnston became a faculty member in 1973 and a full professor in 1994. He is a graduate of Princeton (AM, 1968 and PhD, 1968).

He taught a range of courses, including general chemistry, physical chemistry, and special topics.

Five students earned a doctorate and one a masters under his guidance.

He also prepared and made available five interactive computer packages for general use with a PC.

His dedication, his wit, and his collegial interactions were treasured and will be missed.

With some 4,200 majors distributed across eight different programs and producing well over 64,000 student credit hours and over 770 degrees each year, the Chemistry Department is a major contributor to all of the university's critical performance metrics.

The program continues to provide high quality instruction led by a talented group of chemical education researchers and instructors.

The introductory programs effectively use peer-led learning and active learning/flipped classroom approaches leading to improved student success.

Chemistry has a very strong undergraduate advising program.

The tenured and tenure line faculty continue to produce high quality publications and funded research with research expenditures over \$3 million per year.

The department has the largest Ph.D. program in the university at 150 students and is the leading producer of Ph.D.'s in the university, regularly graduating 10-20 or more per year.
