Honors courses, which were smaller, additionally developed competencies in panel presentations, and public speaking collaboration as students sought to further develop their public presentation acumen.

My course also presented material to help counter fear of public speaking. My Interpersonal Communications course engaged learners in a simultaneously face-to-face and remote classroom (one class on campus; another in a satellite location) and engaged students in the flipped classroom technique. Together, we explored crucial concepts about interpersonal communications, such as self-concept, perception language, emotions, conflict management and resolution, and cultural communication.
