About Robert D. Bullard

Professor Bullard is currently Distinguished Professor of Urban Planning and Environmental Policy at Texas Southern University. He is an award-winning author of eighteen books that address sustainable development, environmental racism, urban land use, industrial facility siting, community reinvestment, housing, transportation, climate justice, disasters, emergency response, and community resilience, smart growth, and regional equity. Dr. Bullard is also co-founder of the HBCU Climate Change Consortium.

In 2020, WebMD gave him its [Health Heroes Trailblazer Award](#) and the United Nations Environment Program (UNEP) honored him with its [Champions of the Earth Lifetime Achievement Award](#), the UN's highest environmental honor, recognizing outstanding leaders from government, civil society and the private sector whose actions have a transformative impact on the environment.
