The Outstanding Psychology Student Award provides support scholarships for full or part-time junior level undergraduate students, pursuing a Psychology major in the College of Arts and Sciences on the USF St. Petersburg campus.

Review of applications and selection of the scholarship recipient will be conducted by the USF St. Petersburg College of Arts & Sciences Scholarship Committee.

Eligibility:

- Students can be nominated by faculty, peers, or themselves.
- Nominees must:
 - ✓ Be a junior psychology major
 - ✓ Have a cumulative GPA of 3.50 or higher
 - ✓ Have a psychology GPA of 3.50 or higher
 - ✓ Completion and submission of application form and required written responses (see attached) and applicant's USF St. Petersburg student transcript (unofficial or official)
 - ✓ Submission of at least one (1) letter of recommendation from a USF St. Petersburg faculty member in support of the application

The Award:

- The student who receives the award will receive \$500.
- The student who receives the award will receive an individual plaque and will also have his/her name engraved on a plaque in the Department of Psychology.

Application Deadline: May 21st, 2021

Notification of awards should take place within three weeks of the application deadline – Friday, June 11, 2021.


