

CORE REQUIREMENTS



All students develop expertise in geopolitics and international economics through two required seminars


INR 6007 SEMINAR IN INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

Advanced study of international relations, including survey of basic literature, analysis of theoretical and methodological approaches and major issues.

INR 6036 SEMINAR IN INTERNATIONAL POLITICAL ECONOMY

Advanced study of the development and politics of the international economic system focusing on theoretical and empirical analysis of cooperation and conflict in trade, aid, and investment relationships. Students develop specialized expertise by taking three courses in one of two concentrations

- The Security and Diplomacy concentration includes courses on international security, American foreign policy, human rights, genocide, and public diplomacy
- The Society and Development concentration includes courses on social movements, the politics of development, comparative politics, social theory, and the social construction of race and racism



Application **REQUIREMENTS**

An applicant must have **one** of the following (a, b, or c) and:

- A 500-word statement of purpose which explains why you are applying to the program
- Official transcripts
- Three (3) letters of recommendation, preferably from academic sources
- GRE recommended

Appropriate bachelor's degree (e.g. political science, international studies, or a related discipline) satisfying at least one of the following criteria:

- "B" average (3.00 on a 4.00 scale) or better in all work attempted while registered as an undergraduate student working toward a baccalaureate degree, or
- "B" average (3.00 on a 4.00 scale) or better in all work attempted while registered as a graduate student working for a graduate degree.

b

Appropriate bachelor's degree (e.g. political science, international studies, or a related discipline) with a "B" average or better and a previous graduate degree with a "B" average or better. In cases where an applicant has a bachelor's and a graduate degree at the time of admission, the credentials and GPA of the graduate degree will be the determining factor for admission.

The equivalent bachelors and/or graduate degrees from a foreign institution. Bachelor's degrees from institutions in the European Higher Education Area (EHEA) are considered equivalent based on the Bologna Accord. For applicants with a 3-year Bachelor's Degree with less than 120 hours, from Non-Bologna Accord Institutions, a transcript evaluation from a NACES member is required to confirm

equivalency.

*Students who lack an appropriate background in the selected concentration may be required to take additional courses to meet concentration minimums.


For International **STUDENTS**

Applicants from countries where English is not the official language, and who have not earned at least a bachelor's degree in the U.S., must also demonstrate proficiency in the English language.

IELTS - 6.5, PTE-A - 53, TOEFL (iBT - 79; PBT - 550), GRE Verbal - 153, or Duolingo - 105.

PROGRAM CURRICULUM

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

Applicants must meet university admission and English proficiency requirements as well as the requirements listed below:

- Three (3) letters of recommendation
- A 500-word statement of purpose which explains why you are applying to the program
- Official transcripts
- GRE recommended

The Master of Arts in International Affairs program develops specialized knowledge and skills through two track options: Security and Diplomacy or Society and Development. All students take two required seminars, a methods course, three classes within their concentration, and three elective courses. Students have the option of writing a thesis as a capstone project or they can complete their degree through a coursework option.
