# WOMEN'S, GENDER, and SEXUALITY STUDIES

Founded in 1972, Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies (WGSS) at USF ranks among the oldest women's studies programs in the United States. A rare freestanding department with its own full-time graduate faculty, we were the first Women's Studies degree-granting program in Florida.



Today, our interdisciplinary graduate faculty are nationally recognized award-winning teachers and scholars, and 100% of our courses, scholarship, and department programming emphasize gender, sexuality, race, class, and/or ability. Faculty expertise includes social movements, gender and health, media studies, science studies, sex trafficking, victimization, motherhood studies, disability studies, intersex and transgender studies, queer and trans of color critique, and transnational feminisms. We also boast over 80 affiliate faculty members representing more than 25 departments and colleges across USF.

We are also small enough for students to work closely with our professors, who are committed to mentoring students toward their goals. Graduate classes typically have fewer than 15 students, and only 5-7 new graduate students are admitted each year.

Most MA students in WGSS are teaching assistants for our popular introductory courses. WGSS teaching assistantships include an 80% tuition waiver, a competitive stipend, health insurance, and in-state tuition rates. All TAs develop their teaching skills through intensive faculty mentoring and coursework.

#### WGS GRADUATE DEGREE IN PRACTICE

The Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies Graduate Certificate in Women's and Gender Studies offers graduate students and working professionals the opportunity to study issues related to gender, race, sexuality, disability, intersectionality, transnationalism, postcolonialism, and social justice.

Students will also learn how to employ feminist and queer research methods to explore their research interests. The certificate experience enhances any education and professional background, including educational, social, or health services.

# WHY PURSUE AN M.A. IN WGS?



Students learn fundamental skills in critical thinking, writing, communication, teamwork, and leadership as they individually and collaboratively work to understand how history, culture, and power shape diverse people's lives.

The M.A. is designed to serve the needs of a variety of students. This program prepares students both for continued academic study and for positions outside the academy, especially in social justice and public-service organizations. Graduates are prepared for Ph.D. and counseling programs, law schools, and public and private sector careers.

# M.A. DEGREE REQUIREMENTS 36 CREDIT HOURS

The M.A. in Women's and Gender Studies has three tracks. Each requires successfully completing the following:

#### • 30 HOURS + THESIS

The thesis option is recommended for students who intend to pursue a doctoral degree.

#### • 30 HOURS + INTERNSHIP

The internship option is recommended for those interested in applied fieldwork.

#### • 36 HOURS + PORTFOLIO

Students for whom the WGS MA may be a terminal degree may wish to complete the program based on 36 hours of coursework plus a writing portfolio.

GRADUATE

The MA in Women's and Gender Studies requires the successful completion of 36 credit hours with at least 15 hours at the 6000 level. The 36 hours are divided as follows:

#### SEVEN ELECTIVE COURSES - 21 credit hours

(approved by the graduate director or the student's major professor) to be selected from among:

- Graduate-level courses offered by the Department of Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies
- Approved graduate-level courses covering women and/or gender, race, ethnicity, class, sexuality, dis/ability that are offered by affiliates in other departments
- Up to one graduate-level course (3 credit hours) in the student's focused area of interest offered by another department
- Up to 6 credit hours of WST 6900 Directed Readings or WST 6910 Directed Research if the student can secure sponsoring WGSS graduate faculty members

#### MA "OPTION" HOURS – 6 credit hours

(under the guidance of the student's major professor):

- Electives/Portfolio Option: 6 credit hours of additional approved elective graduate coursework offered in WGSS or another approved unit plus successful completion of a portfolio
- Internship Option: a minimum of 6 credit hours of WST 5940 Internship, an approved internship experience, typically completed over two semesters
- Thesis Option: a minimum of 6 credit hours of WST 6971 Thesis research and writing, typically completed over two semesters





# Application **REQUIREMENTS**

An applicant must have **one** of the following (a, b, or c) and:

- A personal narrative statement of purpose
- Official transcripts
- A writing sample (appropriate examples include a term paper or research paper)
- GRE recommended
- Three letters of recommendation
- Resume or Curriculum Vita (CV)

Appropriate bachelor's degree (e.g. WGSS or a related discipline) satisfying at least one of the following criteria

- "B" average (3.00 on a 4.00 scale) or better in all work attempted while registered as an undergraduate student working toward a baccalaureate degree, or
- "B" average (3.00 on a 4.00 scale) or better in all work attempted while registered as a graduate student working for a graduate degree.

Appropriate bachelor's degree (e.g. WGSS or a related discipline) with a "B" average or better and a previous graduate degree with a "B" average or better. In cases where an applicant has a bachelor's and a graduate degree at the time of admission, the credentials and GPA of the graduate degree will be the determining factor for admission.

The equivalent bachelors and/or graduate degrees from a foreign institution. Bachelor's degrees from institutions in the European Higher Education Area (EHEA) are considered equivalent based on the Bologna Accord. For applicants with a 3-year Bachelor's Degree

with less than 120 hours, from Non-Bologna Accord Institutions, a transcript evaluation from a NACES member is required to confirm

equivalency.

\*Students who lack an appropriate background in the selected concentration may be required to take additional courses to meet concentration minimums.

Applicants from countries where English is not the official language, and who have not earned at least a bachelor's degree in the U.S., must also demonstrate proficiency in the English language.
