Spanish & Latin American Studies Concentration

This interdisciplinary concentration focuses on the language and culture of the Spanish-speaking world. Spanish is a global language, the second most spoken native language in the world. The historical ties with Spain, the proximity of Spanish America, and the presence of many Spanish speakers in the United States make knowledge of Spanish and the culture of the Spanish-speaking world highly relevant to students in all disciplines.

- 18 hours of Spanish elective coursework

Dual Concentration Requirements: 24 credit hours

- SPN 3300 Advanced Spanish Grammar & Composition (prereq. = SPN 2201) **or** SPN 2340 **or** 2341 Advanced Spanish for Native Speakers I or II (requires placement test)
- SPW 3030 Intro to Hispanic Literary Studies (prereq. = SPN 3300 or 2340 or 2341)
- 6 hours of Spanish elective coursework
- 12 hours for the 2nd Concentration (not including any needed prerequisite coursework)
