Financing, and Subsidy Requirements

Managing Real Estate Development

This module prepares students for the development and implementation of an actual project concept of:

Culmination

The Culmination exercise uses a case study and teamwork to test participants understanding of concepts taught in the classroom. During the final exercise, students present their proposed project to an informal roundtable of community development practitioners, public program staff, and local private lenders, who provide feedback and recommendations.
