## FACILITIES, EQUIPMENT, AND OTHER RESOURCES

The University of South Florida (USF) is the eight largest university in the U.S. and the largest metropolitan research university within the State University System of Florida. USF is one of only four Florida public universities classified by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching in the top tier of research activities, a distinction attained by only 2.3 percent of all universities. The University of South Florida is one of the nation's top public research universities and one of only 40 public research universities nationwide with very high research activity that is designated as community engaged by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching.

The USF Department of Anthropology provides office space, computer equipment, free data storage through Box software, a software license for Statistical Package for the Social Sciences (SPSS) for data analysis, a digital media laboratory for video editing, and support to all faculty and graduate research assistants. The USF library also provides access to digital video editing software and desktop computers in the Digital Media Commons (<a href="https://www.lib.usf.edu/dmc/">https://www.lib.usf.edu/dmc/</a>). No other specialized equipment will be required.

All USF faculty and graduate students have access to facilities, services, and administrative support.

USF's Office of Sponsored Research provides oversight for all proposal preparation and grant support, including compliance with federal regulations, state statutes, university policies, and financial administration of all funded grants. The College of Arts & Sciences employs full-time grants accountants which the USF faculty work with on grant related activity. All grant accounts are strictly separate and auditable. All financial records are available for sponsor review at any time. USF has state contracts with various vendors to obtain the best possible pricing and the waiver of taxes and shipping and handling charges whenever possible.

These institutional resources, specifically related to office space and informational technology, are sufficient for the proposed project.
