

Succeeding in Fall 2020 Classes

As you prepare for classes in Fall 2020, please read this document that we've drafted for you.

Before the Semester

- If you have questions about the classes, feel free to contact the instructor via email. You should be able to find their email address on the department's directory.
- Be in touch with your [academic advisor](#). Plan to meet with them in advance.
- Preview Canvas classes and syllabi early, if available.
 - Look for certain things, such as due dates, workload, books to order, etc.
- Order your books from the [bookstore](#). Even if you don't have access to the syllabus, the bookstore will have on file the books you need to order.
- Read the syllabus or email your instructor to see what technology, such as a computer, camera, or microphone, you might need for the semester.

- When you register for classes on Oasis, you'll notice that the classes have different codes. Consult the chart below for more information. If you still have questions, feel free to email your instructor for more information.

During the Semester

Be disciplined

- Set a schedule and stick to it – you might not have weekly assignments and might feel tempted to procrastinate - this will only increase your stress at a later point.
- Make sure that you attend your first class or complete the designated assignment for First Day Attendance.
- Complete the online assignments even if you attend class.
- Resist the temptation to not attend the face-to-face class (on the days you are allowed).
- Do not wait for the last minute to submit an assignment or to try to log in synchronous meetings.
- Embrace that you have the most responsibility for your learning.

Be proactive

- Visit your instructor's office hours. They are an opportunity for you to meet with your instructor and ask them questions you may have about the course content or assignments.
- Don't be afraid to reach out to your instructor (and talk about your progress in the class, for instance).
- Participate more than you would be inclined in a regular class.
- Try to get to know your classmates.
- During group work, actively contribute and be a productive team player.
- Make a list of the all resources available to you (from tutoring to IT help).

Take care of yourself

- Talk to your professor about your struggles with the class format or with the material.
- Schedule tutoring sessions.
- Take breaks from staring at a screen.
- Do not ignore your mental health and [consult a counselor](#) if needed.
