Measuring the Success of a Supplier Diversity Program

Supplier diversity is a business strategy that encourages the inclusion of businesses owned by ethnic minorities, women, veterans, and members of the LGBT community to grow its supplier base. As organizations conduct more business with diverse suppliers, it becomes important to measure the success of their supplier diversity program to convert it into a competitive advantage.

Even though the impact is significant, it has been found that only 19% of organizations currently measure the economic impact of their supplier diversity programs. It is also important for enterprises to calculate the ripple effects of investments made toward supplier diversity. The economic impact of supplier diversity provides a company with insights about the revenue generated by it while engaging with diverse suppliers and what impact has that diversity created on the local economy.

Disaster Contracting: Prepare Now, the Florida PTAC Can



Help.

Disasters can happen at any time, any place. Federal and state organizations may provide support for major disasters, but did you know that local companies are called on to assist with debris removal, recovery, and other vital services? When a major disaster

strikes, many local businesses may compete for contracts, and agencies are flooded with calls from businesses that are ready to respond. Is your business ready for disaster contracting?

Prepare now to become a registered disaster contractor. The <u>Florida</u>

<u>Procurement Technical Assistance Center</u> (PTAC) and our experienced procurement specialists can help you understand and navigate the registration process and eligibility requirements needed to bid and secure contracts with local, government, and state agencies – at no cost.

Common myths:

"Only FEMA contracts are available."

While FEMA contracts with local businesses in disaster-affected areas, many local, state, and government agencies may assist with relief efforts and have contract opportunities.

"It costs to be a disaster contractor or to get on **the list**."

There are **no fees** associated with registering as a disaster contractor, bidding on contracts, and consulting services from the Florida PTAC are provided at no cost. Furthermore, there is no "priority vendor list."

Tips for success:

- Register your business with all required databases including the <u>Florida</u> <u>Emergency Supplier Network</u> (FESN) and <u>System for Award</u> <u>Management</u> (SAM).
- Verify that your business website is up-to-date and reflects your current services.
- Agencies may consult your website for information.
- Research contracting opportunities. The Florida PTAC can help match your business with agencies.
