Target Audience

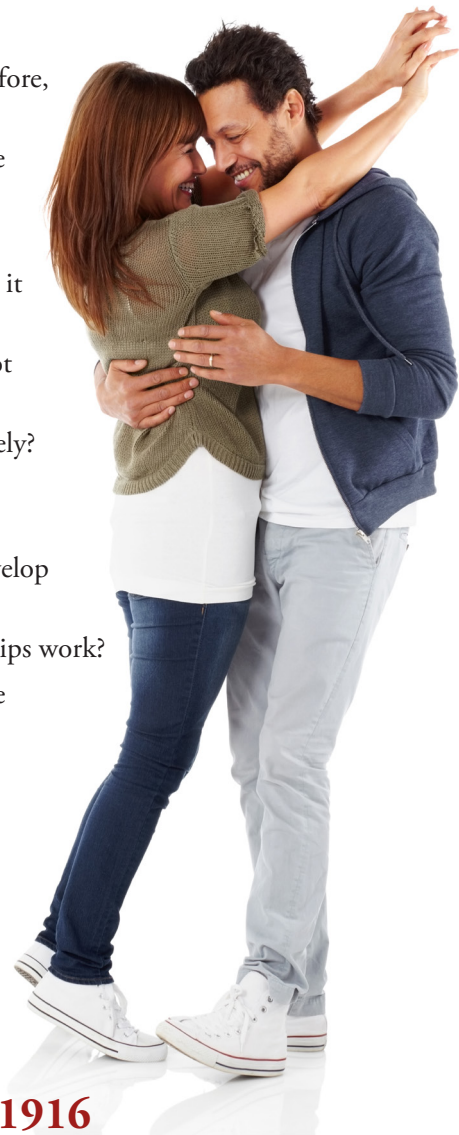
