Research Opportunity

The Interventions for Health Promotion in Oncology and Obesity in Pediatrics (I-HOPE) Lab has several opportunities for students to obtain research experience including on several large NIH grant projects:

- NOURISH-T+ (multisite RCT): a web-based intervention targeting pediatric cancer survivors with overweight/obesity
- ► ADAPT+: involves working with Latino youth and obesity living in rural communities.
- We also have several projects with adolescents and young adult cancer patients being conducted through Moffitt Cancer Center.

What is Involved?

Student responsibilities in the I-HOPE lab are varied and entail different duties, such as systematic literature reviews, participant recruitment, data entry, interviewing, helping with focus groups and other opportunities, depending on skills. There is also the opportunity to receive course credit.
