EDUCATION ABROAD

USF ISRAEL CHILD BEHAVIORAL HEALTH & PEDIATRIC PSYCHOLOGY JUNE 16 - JULY 16, 2019

OVERVIEW

This program will focus on (a) general psychosocial concerns related to children's health (e.g., health promotion and prevention, adherence to medical regimens, hospitalization experiences), and (b) illness, that is, medical disorders commonly addressed by child behavioral health/pediatric psychologists (e.g., diabetes, cancer, obesity and pain). This course is designed to provide students with a broad overview of the field of Child Behavioral Health/Pediatric Psychology. We will also discuss how child behavioral health/pediatric psychologists work within health care systems in the US. We also will have at least one session on trauma that will be augmented with a visit to Yad va shem (major Holocaust museum in Jerusalem). Most importantly, we will take advantage of this course being taught in a different country, with a health care system that functions with a different set of standards and values.

During the program, students will also enjoy daytrips to Jerusalem's Old City, a daytrip Yad ve'shem to visit the Holocaust Memorial, and daytrips to Masada and The Dead Sea.

COURSE INFORMATION

This course is intended to be an upper level, special topics seminar for undergraduate students. However, graduate students are welcome to enroll in the class and will be provided with additional readings and a paper assignment to earn graduate credit. Students can also opt to take independent study credit with the professor for an additional 3 credit hours to enhance their experience, increasing the total number of available credit hours to 6.
