Detention Hearing

Occurs within 24 hours for initial detainment; release or admit to SD

Arraignment Hearing

Occurs within 24-48 hours from time of petition file; juvenile will plead, be diverted, formally charged or direct file to adult system

<u>Diversion Opportunities</u> Teen Court

 Eligible to first-time offenders, ages 13-18

JDAP operated by BAYS

Release from DJJ Residential Commitment Programs

 CRT convenes 60 days prior to reentry (90 for sex offenders) collaborative team includes DJJ, youth, caregiver, school, and community providers

Reentry from Statewide Inpatient Psychiatric Program

 Youth will engage in targeted case management; receives 30-day medication supply
