Restrictions, Obligations and University Authority: USF Policy 0-100 provides the parameters of Signatory Authority and includes restrictions and obligations for the signing of any contracts that involve (a) Debt Management, (b) International Programs, (c) Multi-State Contracts, (d) Personnel, (e) Procurement of Goods and Services, (f) Real Property, and (g) Research. Each Delegator and Delagatee is responsible for understanding the Restrictions and Obligations set forth in USF Policy 0-100.

Delegated Signatory Authority:

- 1. Pursuant to Section 1004.22(3), Florida Statutes, which provides in part that "the president of a university where a division of sponsored research is created, or his or her designees, is authorized to negotiate, enter into, and execute research contracts, and to solicit and accept research grants and donations", I Sub-Delegate to the Associate Director, Technology Transfer Office/Patents and Licensing the authority to sign material transfer agreements and confidentiality agreements.
- 2. I Sub-Delegate to the Associate Director, Technology Transfer Office/Patents and Licensing, the authority to sign all documents necessary to secure letters of patents, copyrights and trademarks on any work products.
