Frank J. Cilluffo is a member of the Board of Advisors for the Global and National Security Institute at USF, assuming his duties in February 2023.

Frank serves as Director of Auburn University's McCrary Institute for Cyber & Critical Infrastructure Security. He has decades of national and homeland security experience derived from working inside and outside government including serving as a Special Assistant for Homeland Security to President Bush in the White House, immediately following the 9/11 attacks on the US. He recently served as a commissioner on the U.S. Cyberspace Solarium Commission and chaired a handful of committees for the Homeland Security Advisory Council on economic security, cybersecurity and counterterrorism.

He has testified before Congress dozens of times on a wide range of issues related to cyberthreats, counterterrorism, security and deterrence, weapons proliferation, intelligence and threat assessments, and emergency management, and has published extensively in major media.
