Academic Dismissal

Students may be academically dismissed from their graduate major for a variety of reasons, including failure to meet academic standards, as well as academic integrity violations, student misconduct or behavior that is deemed an egregious violation of professional behavior. Once processed, the student's status will be changed from Graduate Degree Seeking to Non-Degree Seeking. A change to Non-Degree Seeking status could adversely impact financial aid. Dismissal cannot be retroactive. The effective date will be entered into the student's record by the Office of the Registrar as the First Business Day after the end of the Semester, except in cases of academic dismissal due to academic dishonesty or disruption of academic process. Some of the reasons for academic dismissal include*:

- Failure to successfully satisfy requirements to meet Conditional Admission by the deadline established by the major.
- Receiving an "FF" grade
- Failure to maintain "good standing"
- Failure to make satisfactory progress

*students may be dismissed for other reasons, such as violations of student conduct. Refer to the USF Policy – 6.0021 (<u>http://regulationspolicies.usf.edu/regulations/pdfs/regulation-usf6.0021.pdf</u>) for more information.

To be readmitted, the student will need to reapply for admission, meeting the admission criteria in place at the time. Graduate students who are assigned an "FF" grade will be academically dismissed from the University and will not be eligible to apply to any graduate major at USF.

EXAMPLE WORDING:

Dismissal from the Graduate Program for Professional Misconduct: Graduate students may be dismissed from their program for <u>academic integrity violations</u>, <u>student misconduct or behavior that is deemed an egregious violation of professional behavior</u>. In such instances, the student will be informed by the program of the intent to dismiss and their right for due process and to appeal. If a student appeals the decision to dismiss, s/he must be allowed to maintain enrollment and continue working toward the graduate degree in the same manner as any other graduate student in the program during the appeals process. Continued enrollment is not required to appeal. Once the decision of the appropriate appeals panel is made, it will be final.

Dismissal from the Graduate Program for not meeting academic standards: Graduate students may be dismissed from their program for <u>failure to meet academic standards</u>. In such instances, the students will be notified of the intent to dismiss and informed of their rights for due process and appeal. If a student appeals the decision to dismiss, s/he must be allowed to maintain enrollment and continue working toward the graduate degree in the same manner as any other graduate student in the program during the appeals process. Continued enrollment is not required to appeal. Once the decision of the appropriate appeals panel is made, it will be final.
