 into a major. Consider language that limits how long a Certificate may be active if it is no longer
 having students complete the certificate within the five-year timeframe.

Time Limitations

Doctoral degrees must be completed within seven (7) years from the student's original date of admission for doctoral study. All courses applied to the doctoral degree must be completed within ten (10) years, including courses taken

- 1. prior to admission to the USF doctoral major,
- 2. taken as non-degree seeking, or
- 3. transferred in from other institutions.

There is no time limitation for courses from a completed master's degree used toward a doctoral degree. For students who are readmitted, see Readmission Policy. Typically, a student will reach candidacy within four years, but this may vary per discipline.

Professional level doctoral programs (MD, DPT, PharmD) are subject to program defined time limits. Visit the DPT, MD, and PharmD websites for details. Students in these professional programs can request a time limit extension if needed. However, such a request would only be granted in extraordinary circumstances.

The Doctor of Medicine degree must be completed within six (6) years from the student's original date of admission to the Medical School.
