Intended Program of Study- B.S. Elementary Education (Grades K-6)

- (College) Foreign Language Exit Required- **No**, beginning with students initially entering a Florida College System institution or state university in 2014-2015 and thereafter, coursework for an associate in arts degree shall include demonstration of competency in a foreign lang.
- USF Tampa offers two options for students pursuing a degree in elementary education. This guide provides information for students seeking admission to **The Elementary Cohort Program**. This is a cohort-based program of study includes course work and field experiences in specifically selected partnership sites. This program requires full-time registration each semester including summer.
- Applicants to **The Elementary Teacher Residency Program** must adhere to additional requirements and include supplemental materials with their applications. This program is a competitive, residency-based program designed to develop teaching candidates for elementary classrooms. The program features a school and university faculty-mentored residency experience in which students' coursework is embedded in field experiences within the residency schools. This program requires full-time registration each semester including summer as well as a year-long residency. Students in this program commit to a 7:30 to 3:30 teacher work day.

The following is additional information for the Elementary Education major:

- The College of Education (COEDU) has a SEPARATE APPLICATION PROCESS from that of the University of South Florida. Please allow enough time to apply and receive acceptance to USF before applying to the College.
- The elementary education program only admits students during specific terms. It is important to arrange a schedule that will allow for timely completion of requirements and allow for application to both USF and the COEDU for acceptance during the appropriate time frame as outlined online: (<http://www.coedu.usf.edu/main/sas/AdmissionRequirements.html>)
- All applicants to the COEDU (except Exercise Science) must take and pass all sections of the General Knowledge Test, including Math, Reading, Language, and Essay.
- All applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5.
- EDF 1005 must have been passed with a C- or better. As long as all pre-requisite courses are complete or IN-PROGRESS, the student may apply.
- Florida Teacher Certification Exams (Professional Education and Subject Area Exams) are required for graduation, as the degree is tied to earning a Florida Teaching Certificate. Students are encouraged to take these in fall of the last year to ensure enough time to retest if necessary. Certification will be reflected on the official transcripts.
- The Elementary Education Program is designed to prepare students to enter the classroom as effective, enthusiastic, and responsible educators. The clinically rich program embraces a pedagogy of inquiry, innovation, inclusion, and integration. This is a full-time, cohort-style program with clinical experiences in primary and intermediate elementary grades. Students can select from two options: Elementary Education Urban Teacher Residency Partnership Program and Elementary Education Cohort Program.
