The following is additional information for the Mass Communications major:

- The Bachelor of Arts in Mass Communications requires students to pursue the Broadcast-News (MBCN) or Broadcast-Production (MBPP) sequence.
- Most students pursue internships while at USF; while students are responsible for securing their own internships, staff and faculty can assist students with their search, and depending on internship applicability to their academic and professional goals, students can earn credit for internships.
- This major requires two semesters of foreign language to be completed in a college or university setting. If a student is already proficient in a foreign language, they can discuss the options of testing out of the foreign language through the CLEP or World Languages Placement test with an advisor
- There are opportunities for students to submit creative writing pieces into USF journals or outside entities.
- Students must earn a 2.5 major GPA and 2.0 overall and USF GPA to graduate from the university.
- While students will gain experience through coursework, building a professional network and resume is crucial for post-graduate success.
- Students can use electives that are outside of the Mass Communications department to pursue a minor in a different area of study; students can meet with an advisor to explore options
