The following is additional information for the World Language major (Spanish and Latin American Studies concentration):

- The Interdisciplinary Spanish and Latin American Studies concentration focuses on the language and culture
 of the Spanish-speaking world. Spanish is a global language, the second most spoken native language in the
 world. The historical ties with Spain, the proximity of Spanish America, and the presence of many Spanish
 speakers in the United States make knowledge of Spanish and the culture of the Spanish-speaking world
 highly relevant to students in all disciplines.
- It is possible to add a second World Languages concentration. Speak with a World Languages advisor to learn more.
- All undergraduate students in any degree program can participate in undergraduate research. There are a
 number of options to receive academic credit for a mentored research experience and to have the experience
 show on the official transcript. Students who wish to enroll in an undergraduate research course should
 consult with their academic advisor to understand how the credit will apply towards the degree requirements.
- Students must have at least a 2.0 GPA before graduation.
- Students are recommended to continually gain relevant experience for their intended career and/or graduate school path. This might include becoming involved in volunteering or research, completing an internship, or being active on campus with an activity or organization relevant to future goals.
