## The following is additional information for the Health Care Administration B.S. major:

- 1. The major is a total of 39 credit hours.
- 2. A minimum C- is required in major core courses.
- 3. Our graduates qualify for positions as administrators for hospitals and other healthcare facilities.
- 4. Our graduates can also take the examination to become licensed nursing home and assisted living community administrators.
- 5. The internship (GEY 4945, 9 academic credit hours/650 hours), scheduled after successful completion of all major prerequisites and all but one of the required courses, prepares students for positions in nursing home administration.
- 6. Students who do not wish to complete the full-time internship (GEY 4945) will need to choose 3 undergraduate courses/9 credit hours of electives. Students will need to receive permission from the Undergraduate Director and meet with the Academic Advisor to decide which classes best fit their goals, at least a semester in advance.
