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The following is additional information for the Psychology major:

- Lower level psychology courses (level 1000 and 2000) count towards degree but are not equivalent to 3000 and 4000 level psychology courses.
- The Psychology Department at USF offers a general BA, as well as two concentrations: Advanced Research Experience in Psychology and Diversity.
- Foreign Language Requirement: Students need to show proficiency in a foreign language to graduate. This can be accomplished by taking two semesters of the same foreign language in college or by taking a placement test or CLEP exam if the student speaks a second language. Please consult an advisor to see which method will be best.
- · A psychology degree has a strong emphasis in theory and research.
- Students who accumulate 3 D and/or F grades in major coursework will not be allowed to continue in the Psychology major. Additionally, those students will no longer be allowed to take psychology courses, which may prevent them from pursuing degree programs that require psychology coursework. Grade forgiveness does not apply to the D/F Policy.
- Students must maintain at least a 2.0 GPA throughout the degree.
- Students are recommended to continually gain relevant experience for their intended career and/or graduate school
 path. This might include becoming involved in volunteering or research, completing an internship, or working in a paid
 position related to their interests.
