Unofficial transcripts will not be accepted; the same applies to photocopies of recent grade reports or report cards. *The official transcript is usually requested from your school's registrar's office.*
NOTE: *To be considered for a tuition exemption, a cumulative GPA of 3.0 is required.*

- Copy of French ID
