Statement of Purpose, essays A and B (See explanation on page 3.) An official, current transcript (record of grades) indicating current Grade Point Average (GPA) from your most recent high school or college. Unofficial transcripts will not be accepted; the same applies to photocopies of recent grade reports or report cards. The official transcript is usually requested from your school's registrar's office. We will accept transcripts delivered through mail or sent online, directly from your university or school. **NOTE:** To be considered for a tuition exemption, a cumulative GPA of 3.0 is required.
